Here we have two novella-length stories, each with a similar overall feel: one of looking at the trees rather than the forest, taking us through the human thoughts and feelings about the little interactions of daily life as much as, if not more than, any grand sweeping international events—even when those events provide not only the backdrop for the story, but also fulfil an important narrative role.

A lot of stories set in Israel focus heavily on making the case for Zionism at the expense of Palestinians; I was glad to see that this was not really the case here, beyond that yes there was a conflict between Israel and—in the narrator's voice—"marauding Arabs", but there was otherwise no particular political or racial investment, just, there was war and bad things happen in war. The focus is consistently more on individual people, private motivations and fears, losses and hopes.

In the case of both parts of this book, the quality of the writing is excellent, the characterizations strong, and the plot sufficiently engaging to keep the reader turning pages. All in all, a recommendable read.

Israeli author Batya Casper, PhD now lives in both Israel and in California earned her bachelor's degree in English Literature her Masters and PhD in theater Arts for UCLA. She is an actor, director and theater educator as well as the author of three books – ISRAELA, ELECTRA, and HIDDEN:NISTAR.

Dr Casper's experience in theater, both as an actor and as a director, shines forth in these two novellas that address the impact of war, peace, prejudice and family connections. The initial novel is set in the 1960s in Israel, young Tikvah lives with her grandparents Baruch and Pnina Lazamof. The story deals with death of the grandparents, the presence of mysterious Hannah, and how Tikvah copes with the loss of her grandparents by exploring the mystery of Hannah. The second novella deals with the WW II in England as Arthur and Inda, a couple, cope with the ravages of war, care of stray children, and other needy people, and how they all respond to the horrors of the war.

Dr Casper was raised in Israel, and has said, 'I have watched friends and family struggle, question, sacrifice their children. It is the reason I write.' She certainly achieves her goal in both of these very fine novellas – exquisitely written with a flair for the cinematic depiction of both character and plot lines. Strongly recommended. Depicting the horrors of living adjacent to war, these two novellas are compelling peeks into struggle and resilience. "Hidden" shares a broad range of perspectives from Israeli children who have already known loss, but face even more when their grandparents are taken. Tikvah rises as a stunning character in this dramatically unraveled tale, penned with stoicism and tenderness. Her relationship with betrayal and kindness, upon discovering a dangerous secret, puts morality on the scales of life and death, which makes for a fascinating read. Sarah takes on a larger role later in the story, but Tikvah is the character that first grabs readers' attention. The second story changes time and place, to England during World War 2, and once again shows the impact of everyday violence on one's mental health and fortitude. The mood is somewhat lighter in Indra and Arthur's story, perhaps because of the anecdotal nature of the exposition, the flashbacks, and the looser writing style. Both novellas hit hard, and share perspectives that are rarely considered in war—those of the youngest eyes on the battlefield. Exploring trauma and healing atop richly painted backdrops makes for intense but pleasant reading, thanks to Casper's striking, subtle, and revelatory writing.
